(Reuters) - European Union antitrust regulators have asked Luxembourg for information on its tax rulings for McDonald's after labor unions accused the U.S. fast food chain of avoiding taxes, a person involved in the issue said on Tuesday.

The move, which neither the EU nor Luxembourg would immediately confirm, falls well short of the proceedings the EU has instigated against other U.S. multinationals in Luxembourg and elsewhere, where Brussels believes unfairly low taxation may have

EU Seeks Information on Luxembourg's Tax Dealings With McDonald's

Move falls short of the formal investigations that have been opened in recent months

BRUSSELS—European Union authorities are seeking information from Luxembourg over its tax dealings with **McDonald's** Corp., in the latest phase of a widening investigation into illegal tax sweeteners for multinational companies.

Regulators in Brussels have sent a letter to Luxembourg's government asking it to explain its tax arrangements with the U.S.-based fast-food chain, two people familiar with the matter said Tuesday.

The inquiry follows a report last month by U.S. and European trade unions claiming that McDonald's had avoided about €1 billion in taxes between 2009 and 2013 by funneling royalties to Luxembourg.

McDonald's and EU regulators didn't immediately respond to requests for comment.

The EU's letter was first reported by Reuters.

While the move falls short of the formal investigations that have been opened in recent months into tax deals struck by four other multinationals—**Apple** Inc. in Ireland, **Amazon.com** Inc. and **Fiat** SpA in Luxembourg and **Starbucks** Corp. in the Netherlands—the letter demonstrates the political momentum behind the EU tax probes.

At a time of deep national austerity, governments across the continent are desperate to shore up their finances and demonstrate to taxpayers that wealthy multinationals are paying their fair share of tax.

BRÜSSEL (Dow Jones)--Die EU-Steuerprüfer nehmen ein weiteres weltweit tätiges Unternehmen unter die Lupe: die Fastfoodkette McDonald's. Sie haben von der Luxemburger Regierung Informationen über die Steuerabkommen mit dem US-Konzern angefordert, wie zwei mit dem Vorgang vertraute Unternehmen sagten.

Sie reagieren damit offensichtlich auf eine Beschwerde amerikanischer und europäischer Handelsverbände. McDonald's habe durch entsprechende Deals mit Luxemburg in der Zeit von 2009 bis 2013 rund 1 Milliarde Euro Steuern gespart, hatten sie vorgebracht.

Weder vom Unternehmen noch von den EU-Aufsehern war zunächst eine Stellungnahme erhältlich. Über die Aufforderung der EU hatte zuvor bereits die Nachrichtenagentur Reuters berichtet.

Zwar handele es sich im Fall von McDonald's nicht um eine offizielle Untersuchung wie sie bei Apple in Irland, Amazon.com und Fiat in Luxemburg und Starbucks in den Niederlanden eingeleitet worden sei, hieß es. Doch belege der Brief an Luxemburgs Regierung, wie ernst es der EU mit der Untersuchung von "Steuersparmodellen" sei.

BRUXELLES, 31 mars (Reuters) - La Commission européenne a demandé davantage d'informations au Luxembourg sur sa réglementation fiscale après des accusations d'évasion fiscale formulées à l'encontre de McDonald's, a-t-on appris mardi auprès d'une personne impliquée dans le dossier.

Des syndicats et une organisation caritative accusent le géant américain de la restauration rapide d'avoir échappé à environ un milliard d'euros d'impôts entre 2009 et 2013 en faisant transiter une partie de son chiffre d'affaires par une société luxembourgeoise, ce qui justifie selon eux une enquête de la Commission européenne.



The European Commission has requested further information on Luxembourg tax regulations after tax evasion charges were filed against McDonald's, Reuters reports.

Unions and a charity have accused the US fast food giant of avoiding paying around one billion euros in taxes between 2009 and 2013 by passing a portion of its revenues through a Luxembourg company.
